Prep-work

- 1. Write a great book.
- 2. Understand your book's content is about value to the reader.
- 3. Establish what will enhance the experience for the book club.

- 5. Design a Pinterest board for each book to assist book club hosts.
- 6. Create blog and newsletter posts about the book and the value to the reader.
- 7. Take advantage of <u>online resources</u> to create games for the book club/readers.

- 3. Subscribe to the <u>Blue Ridge Reader Connections</u> BRRC. Take advantage of the book club lists and all the many aids for writers. The <u>BRRC Facebook</u> private group is also a good resource to network with other writers who are interested in connecting to readers.
