Draft to Digital (D2D)

- *budget friendly*
- *not as many options/customizations*
- *paperback/print and ebook files*

Reedsy

- *budget friendly*
- *writing possible in app*
- *more customization than D2D*
- *can also code formatting in HTML*

PAID

Microsoft Word

- *around \$80 (if you don't already have it)*
- *writing software as well*
- *troublesome with "holding" formatting in writing*
- *learning curve to become proficient*

Scrivener

- *around \$49 (if you don't already have it)*
- *designed for writing and plotting*
- *lot of customization*
- *steep learning curve for formatting*
- *can do parts/volumes for box sets*

more paid...

Atticus

- \$147
- *writing/drafting capabilities*
- *easy-to-see preview of end product*
- *not as steep a learning curve*
- *lot of customization available*
- *newer, some bugs still*
- *highly responsive tech team*
- *online and offline mode*
- *not able to do parts/volumes for box set at this time*

Vellum

- *\$199/ebook only, \$249/ebook and paperback*
- *only available for Mac*
- *not meant for writing in*
- *easy-to-see preview of end product*
- *amazing end product, a ton of customization*
- *parts/volumes for box set available*
- *probably most intuitive/user friendly*
- *some learning curve, not as steep as formatting with Scrivener*
- *can do ebook and print files simultaneously*
- *customizes vendor-specific links*
- *can copy and drag files to duplicate into other books you are formatting*
