Tips to Eliminate the Passive Voice

"Verbs are the most important of all your tools. They push the sentence forward and give it momentum. Active verbs push hard; passive verbs tug fitfully." William Zinsser

- 1. Use strong nouns and active verbs.
- 2. Establish the subject does the action.
- 3. Avoid to-be verbs and the word by.
- 4. Consult with <u>Grammarly</u> or <u>ProWriting Aid</u> for assistance.
- 5. Change the order of sentences that use the word **as**. This often signifies a chronological problem or passive sentence.
- 6. Search for adverbs and rewrite to reflect strong nouns and active verbs.
- 7. Revise sentences to place adjectives (if needed) before the noun.
- 8. Reword sentences and phrases that begin with it or there.
- 9. Focus on deep POV and immerse the reader into the subject and action.
- 10. Speed up pacing.
- 11. Word frequency counter.

Passive voice focuses on who is receiving the action instead of the sentence subject.
